

**REV. SEASTRAND,
FORMERLY OF S. F.,
CLAIMED BY DEATH**

**Ex-Pastor in Minnehaha County
Dies After Stroke Suffered
Week Ago Sunday**

**Special Funeral Services to Be
Held at Madison Methodist
Episcopal Church**

Special funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the Methodist church, Madison, S. D., for the Rev. Herman Denslow Seastrand, formerly of Sioux Falls, Methodist minister in Junius and Oldham, S. D., who died early Monday morning.

Rev. Seastrand suffered a stroke a week ago Sunday, and was taken to the Madison hospital, where he died after growing gradually weaker throughout the week.

Born in Red Wing, Minn.

All Methodist clergymen in this

district will join in a special choir for music during the services. Dr. F. E. Lockridge, Brookings, S. D., district superintendent, will conduct the services, assisted by the Rev. Carl W. Stromberg, Madison, Methodist minister, and the Rev. A. L. Reinearson, Chester, S. D. Burial will be in the family plot in Red Wing, Minn.

Rev. Seastrand was born in Red Wing, Minn., February 14, 1873, and spent the first 23 years of his life near there. He was married in St. Peter, Minn., October 23, 1895, to Miss Jennie Marie Perry. They lived there and in Minneapolis, and came to South Dakota 32 years ago, first settling in Sioux Falls.

Left Here in 1911

In 1911 they moved to Alcester, S. D., where Rev. Seastrand began his ministry. He had attended Hamline university in Minneapolis. He had also been a Methodist minister in Chester and Colton, S. D., before moving to Junius, S. D.

He is survived by his widow, six daughters, Marjorie, Memphis, Tenn., Mrs. E. M. Feind, Philadelphia, Pa., Mrs. H. C. Caspar, Bird Island, Minn., Mrs. A. B. Butters, Los Angeles, Calif., Mrs. T. B. Dodson, Duluth, Minn., and Dorothy, Sioux Falls; two brothers, Rudolph Seastrand, St. Paul, and J. H. Seastrand, Minneapolis; three sisters, Mrs. Augda Peterson and Mrs. Sella Lee Nelson, both of Minneapolis, and Mrs. Helma Swenson, St. Paul, and six grandchildren.
